“Making Blank Vote Count: An Agency Theory of Electoral Boycott and Thailand's 2006 Parliamentary Election” (Presented at Political Economy Workshop, Harvard University: Feb 2010)

This study is the first of its kind to employ the GIS technology and statistical analysis to examine the relationship between violence in Thailand's Southern Conflict and internal displacement in the conflict zone. In this project, I have travelled to conflict zone and interviewed with top military officers, policy makers, public servants and leading scholars to gather information and highly classified data for the project. I have, thus, obtained strong connections with various governmental and academic institutions.
