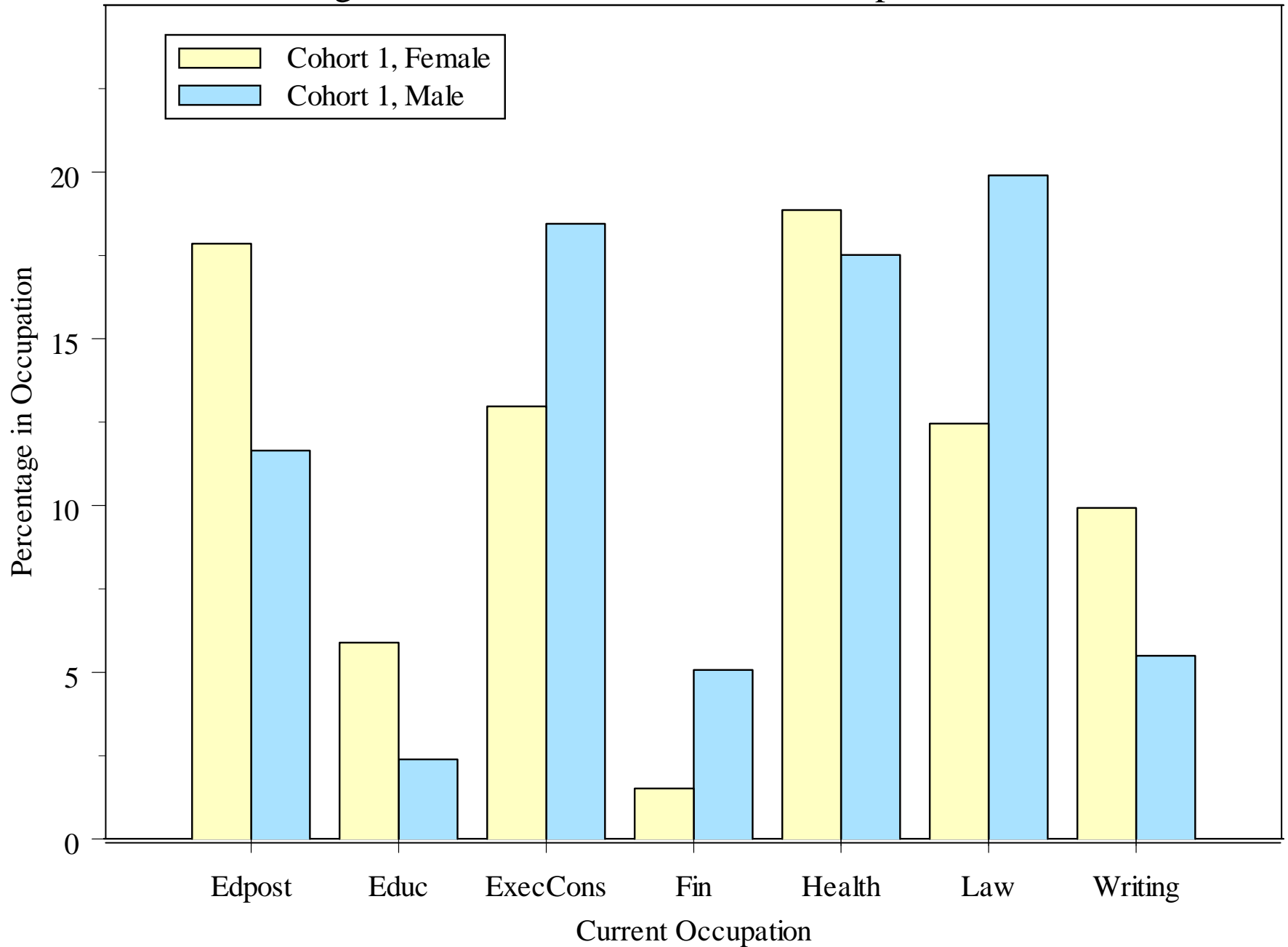
- Notes for Figures 1, 2, 3
- Edpost = post-secondary; Educ = K-12; ExecCons = executive, management, consultant, marketing, sales; Fin = financial services; Health = medical professions; Writing = writing, journalist, artist, performer.
- Remember: Cohort 1 is graduating classes 1969-73; Cohort 2 is 1979-82; Cohort 3 is 1989-92.

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- Interpretive notes for Figures 1, 2, 3
- Shift of men from Cohort 1 to 3 into finance and the executive, consultant, and managerial group and out of the health and law professions.
- By Cohort 3 women's percentage in law is higher than is men's.
- In all three cohorts women are more likely to be academics than men are.

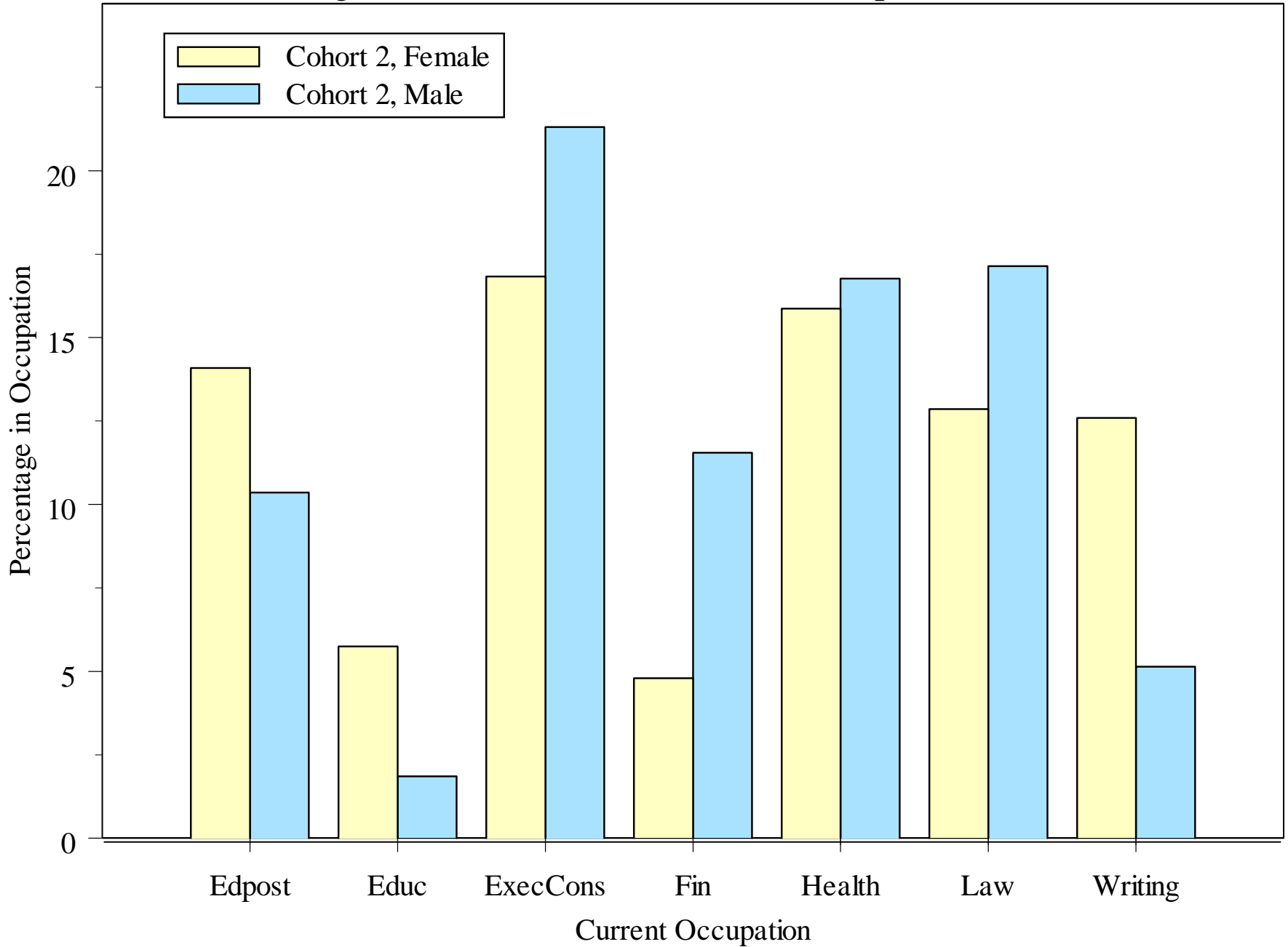
Percentage in Most Prevalent Current Occupations: Cohort 1

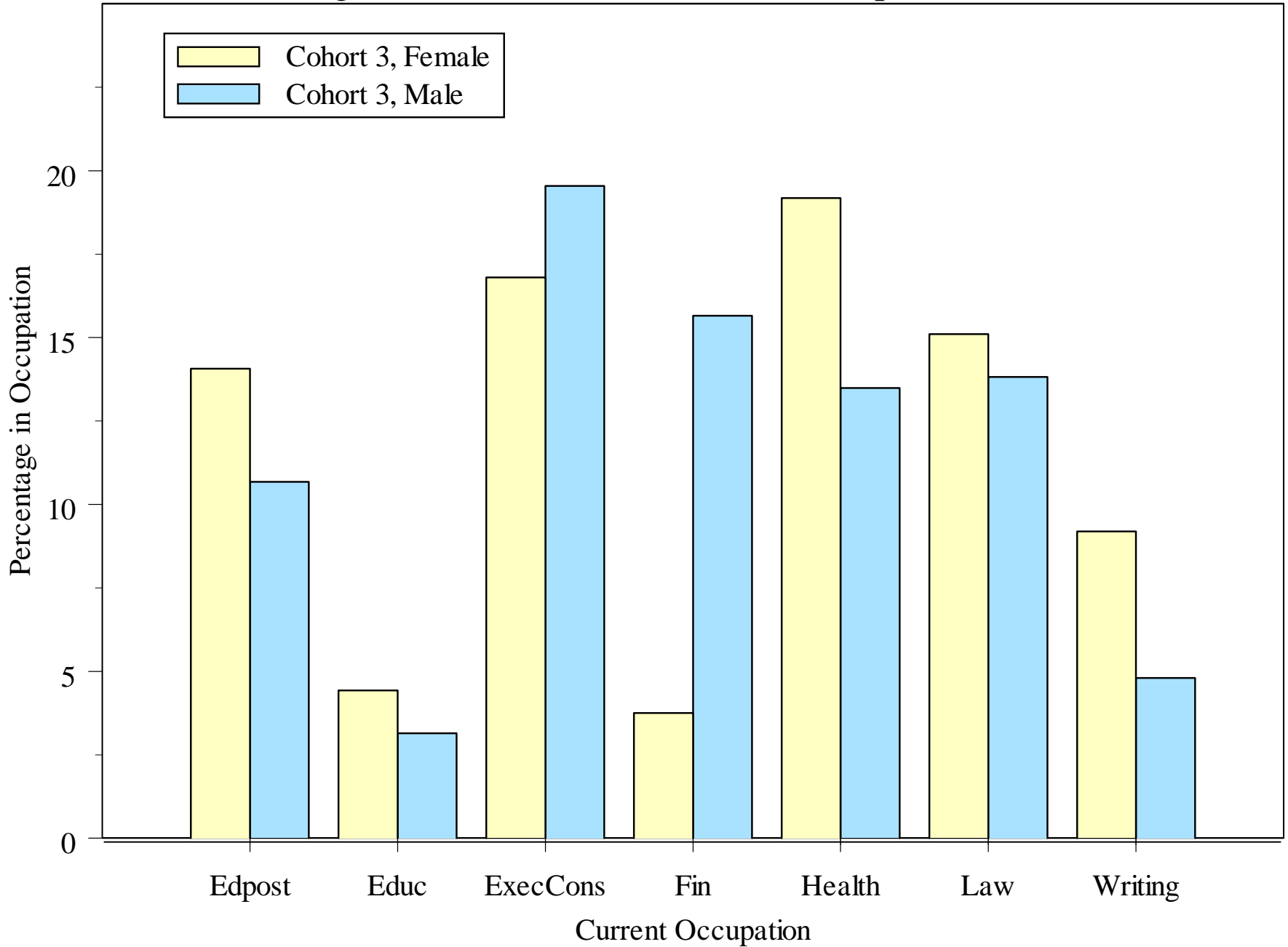
Percentage in Most Prevalent Current Occupations: Cohort 2

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- Interpretive notes for Figures 4, 5
- Vast majority of women and men in all three cohorts are employed and are full-time, full-year workers.
- But women are far more likely to be part-time workers and are more likely not to be working than are men across all three cohorts.
