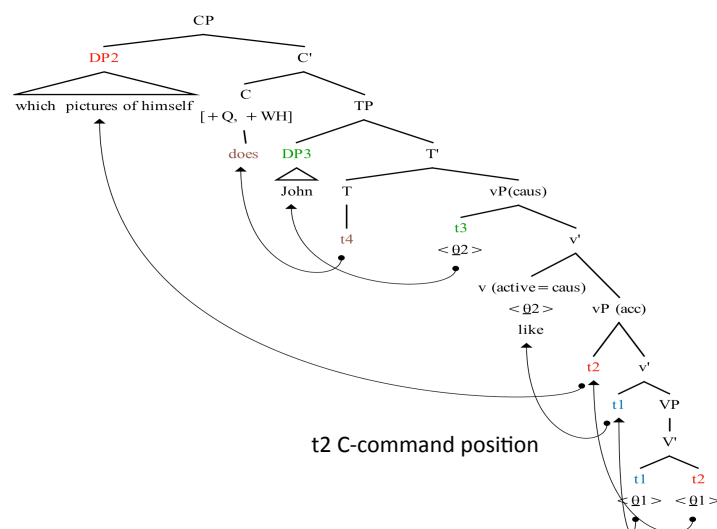
## Movement and Binding

- Condition A
  - A reflexive must have an antecedent that:
    - C-commands the reflexive
    - Is in the same minimal binding domain as the reflexive
- Condition B
  - A pronoun must have an antecedent that:
    - Does not C-command the pronoun, and/or
    - Is not in the same minimal binding domain as the pronoun

## Does movement impact binding?

- Which pictures of himself<sub>j</sub> does John<sub>j</sub> like?
- The above is grammatical
  - Is condition A satisfied at Surface structure?
  - Is condition A satisfied at Deep structure?

## Movement and ambiguity

- When will John say that Susan will arrive?
- A Wh-adjunct can more than one origin point since it is unconstrained by Theta role/case assignment
