

Commander Anthony R. Raneses Director and Chief of Contracting, CJTF-HOA

Commander Anthony R. Raneses is a native of Salinas, California, who attended the University of California at Davis in 1992 earning a degree in economics. A prior U.S. Air Force enlisted, Commander Raneses received a direct commission in the Supply Corps in April 1999 while serving in the U.S. Naval Reserve.

Commander Raneses' last duty station was Naval Supply Systems Command, Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania, where he served as Special Projects Officer for the Office of the Commander, Naval Supply Systems Command (COMNAVSUPSYSCOM). Commander Raneses holds graduate degrees from the Virginia Polytechnic Institute & State University, and the U.S. Naval War College, respectively. He is also a Master of Sustainability degree candidate (forthcoming in 2020) at Harvard University.

As a member of the Acquisition Professional Community, Commander Raneses has previously held contracting warrants ranging from \$10 million to unlimited dollar threshold from both Defense and Federal Civilian agencies.
